

## CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT

### Superintendent

This Contract is entered into by and between the Board of Education of the Olivet School District (hereinafter "Board") and Rocky Aldrich (hereinafter "Superintendent"). The Board in accordance with its action found in the minutes of its meeting held on the 13th day of June, 2016, hereby employs Administrator for a 3 year period commencing on July 1, 2016 and ending on June 30, 2019, according to the following terms and conditions.

1. Mr. Aldrich shall perform the duties of Superintendent as prescribed by the Board and as may be established, modified and/or amended from time to time by the Board. The Superintendent acknowledges the ultimate authority of the Board with respect to his responsibilities and directions related thereto.

2. The Superintendent represents that he possesses, holds and will maintain all certificates, credentials and qualifications required by law, including the provisions of Sections 1246 and 1536 of the Revised School Code, the regulations of the Michigan Department of Education, and those required by the Board to serve in the position assigned. Superintendent agrees, as a condition of his continued employment, to meet and maintain all certification and continuing education requirements for the position assigned, as are and may be required by law and/or by the State Board of Education. If at any time Superintendent fails to maintain all certificates, credentials, continuing education requirements and/or qualifications for the position assigned as required herein, this Contract shall automatically terminate and the Board shall have no further obligation hereunder.

3. Superintendent agrees to devote his talents, skills, efforts and abilities toward competently and proficiently fulfilling all duties and responsibilities of the position assigned. Superintendent agrees to faithfully perform those duties assigned by the Board and to comply with the directives of the Board with respect thereto. Further, Superintendent agrees to comply with and fulfill all responsibilities and tasks required by state and federal law and regulations and by the Board to carry out the educational programs and policies of the School District during the entire term of this Contract. Superintendent agrees that he will diligently and competently discharge his duties on behalf of the School District to enhance the operation of the School District and will use his best efforts to maintain and improve the quality of the programs and services of the School District.

4. Superintendent shall be paid at an annual (twelve month) salary rate of not less than one hundred twenty thousand Dollars (\$120,000) in consideration of his performance of the duties and responsibilities of the position assigned in conformance with the requirements and expectations of the Board. The annual salary shall be paid in twenty-six (26) equal bi-weekly installments beginning with the commencement of the fiscal/contract year (July 1 - June 30). The Board shall contribute to an IRS Section 403b or 457 account of the Superintendent's choosing, an amount not less than Five Thousand (\$5000) annually during the term of this contract. This is to be paid at the beginning of July.

The Board hereby retains the right to increase the annual salary of Superintendent during the term of this Contract. Any such increase shall be reflected in a written amendment to this Contract.

Consistent with the provisions of Section 1250 of the Revised School Code, Superintendent's job performance and job accomplishments will be significant factors in determining any adjustment to Superintendent's compensation.

5. Superintendent is employed on the basis of fifty-two (52) weeks of work per contract/fiscal year (July 1 through June 30). Superintendent shall be granted vacation time of 25 days per contract/fiscal year. Vacation days must be used within the contract/fiscal year in which they are first made available and Superintendent shall not receive any additional compensation in lieu of use of vacation days. Superintendent should schedule use of vacation days in a manner to minimize interference with the orderly operation and conduct of business of the School District. All scheduling of vacation is subject to the approval of the Board President. Superintendent is allowed 12 sick days/year, 3 of these days may be for personal use.

6. The Superintendent's performance shall be evaluated by the Board annually and using the criteria outlined in 1249 of the Revised School Code and such other provisions of the Revised School Code as are applicable to the Superintendent's evaluation and an evaluation process mutually agreed to by the Board and the Superintendent.

7. The Board shall be entitled to terminate the Superintendent's employment at any time during the term of this Contract when it determines that Superintendent has engaged in acts of moral turpitude, misconduct, dishonesty, fraud, insubordination, incompetency, inefficiency, if Superintendent materially breaches the terms and conditions of this Contract, or for other causes that are not arbitrary or capricious, as determined by the Board.

The foregoing standards for termination of this Contract during its term shall not be applicable to non-renewal of this Contract at the expiration of its term, which decision is discretionary with the Board.

In the event that the Board undertakes to dismiss Superintendent during the term of this Contract, he shall be entitled to written notice of charges and an opportunity for a hearing before the Board. In the event of termination of employment during the term of this Contract, this Contract shall automatically terminate and the Board shall have no further obligation under this Contract.

8. In the event of Superintendent's mental and/or physical incapacity to perform the duties of his office, he shall be granted an initial leave of ninety (90) work days for purpose of recovery. The Superintendent shall first exhaust any accumulated sick leave and accrued vacation time, with the balance of the ninety (90) work day period to be unpaid. Upon utilizing leave under this provision, Administrator shall furnish medical certification to the Board (or its designee) respecting the necessity for the leave.

If the Board (or designee) has reason to doubt the validity of the medical certification supplied by Superintendent, it may require a second opinion, at Board expense.

Superintendent may request a ninety (90) work day unpaid leave extension in the event of his physical and/or mental inability to return to work at the expiration of the initial leave interval, as described above, provided that there is a verified prognosis that Superintendent will be able to resume his duties at the conclusion of the extended leave interval. Medical certification shall be supplied by

Superintendent as a condition to any leave extension. Any extensions of leave for this purpose shall be at the discretion of the Board.

If Superintendent is unable to or does not resume work at the conclusion of a leave taken under this paragraph (or any extension thereof), his employment and this Contract may be terminated at the option of the Board. However, no such termination shall occur where restoration after leave is required by the Family and Medical Leave Act.

Prior to resumption of duty after an unpaid leave of absence for a serious health condition, Superintendent shall provide to the Board a fitness for duty certification from Superintendent's health care provider. A second opinion may be required by the Board, at its expense, unless the securing of the second opinion in this context is precluded by the Family and Medical Leave Act.

9. Superintendent agrees that he shall not be deemed to be granted continuing tenure in the position initially assigned or to which he may be assigned or transferred or in any capacity other than that of a classroom teacher, should the probationary period required for tenure as a teacher be fulfilled, by virtue of this Contract or any employment assignment (requiring certification) with the School District. Nor shall the decision of the Board not to continue or renew the employment of Superintendent for any subsequent period in any capacity, other than as a classroom teacher, as may be required by the Teachers' Tenure Act, be deemed a breach of this Agreement or a discharge or demotion within the provisions of the Michigan Teachers' Tenure Act.

10. Superintendent shall submit to such medical examinations, supply such information and execute such documents as may be required by any underwriter, policyholder or third party administrator providing insurance programs specified under this Contract. Additionally, upon request of the Board, Superintendent shall authorize the release of medical information necessary to determine if Superintendent is capable of performing the essential job functions required by his/her assignment, with or without reasonable job accommodation(s). Any physical or mental examination or disclosure of such information required of administrator by the Board shall be job related and consistent with business necessity. Any medical or psychological examination under this section shall be at Board expense. Any information obtained from medical or psychological examinations or inquiries shall be considered and treated as confidential.

11. Upon proper application and acceptance for enrollment by the appropriate insurance underwriter, policyholder and/or third party administrator, the Board shall make benefit cost payments, as specified below, on behalf of Superintendent and his/her eligible dependents for enrollment in the following insurance programs:

Health insurance: Simply Blue High Deductible Health Care Plan or equivalent in which the administrator pays the deductible.

Dental insurance: ADN benefits for dental are (80/80/80) if administrator carries health insurance and (50/50/50) if administrator opts out of health insurance (See attached document)

Term life insurance: (Superintendent only)

Vision insurance: ADN benefits for vision ( See attached document)

Long Term Disability insurance: (Superintendent only)

Superintendent agrees that the Board has the right to allocate to Superintendent responsibility for a portion of the medical benefit plan costs and premiums for the plans and products specified above, as may be determined by the Board. The contributions required of Superintendent shall not be less than the amount determined by the Board to be necessary to comply with the Publicly Funded Health Insurance Contribution Act, 2011 PA 152. The Board will notify Superintendent of the amounts for which he is responsible in excess of the Board contributed medical benefit plan costs and premiums. To the extent that the medical benefit plan costs and premiums associated with the above plans and products exceed the level of the Board's contributions, Superintendent hereby authorizes payroll deduction for all excess medical benefit plan costs and premium amounts required to maintain enrollment.

If Superintendent makes a voluntary written election not to avail himself of the health /medical coverage offered by the Board, he will instead receive \$500, on a monthly basis, under a qualified Section 125 plan, on the further condition that Superintendent furnishes written evidence that he is enrolled in another health/medical benefits plan that meets the minimum value and coverage requirements of the Affordable Care Act.

12. The Board reserves the right to change the identity of the insurance carrier, policyholder or third party administrator for any of the above coverages, provided that comparable coverage, as determined by the Board, is maintained during the term of this Contract. The Board shall not be required to remit medical benefit plan costs or premiums for any insurance coverages for Superintendent and his eligible dependents if enrollment or coverage is denied by the insurance underwriter, policyholder or third-party administrator. The terms of any contract or policy issued by any insurance company or third-party administrator shall be controlling as to all matters concerning benefits, eligibility, coverage, termination of coverage, and other related matters. Superintendent is responsible for assuring completion of all forms and documents needed to receive the above-described insurance coverage. The Board, by remitting the medical benefit costs and premium contributions required under this Contract to provide the above-described plans and products, shall be relieved from all liability with respect to insurance benefits.

13. Superintendent is entitled to ten paid holidays for which no service to the School District is required: (enumerate holidays).

14. If Superintendent is absent from duty on account of personal illness or disability, he shall be allowed full pay for a total of 90 days per contract year. Unused paid leave days hereunder shall be cumulative to a maximum of 90 days for absence due to personal illness or disability of Superintendent.

15. Superintendent shall be eligible to be reimbursed for travel, meals and lodging in accordance with per diem expense and reimbursement standards and procedures established by the Board. Any expense to be incurred by Administrator for out-of-district travel shall be submitted in advance for review and approval by the Board President. Superintendent shall be required to present an itemized account of his reasonable and necessary expenses in accordance with direction of the Board or its designee. Superintendent shall be reimbursed \$250/month for business related, incidental expenses within the district. The amount may be increased at the discretion of the Board.

Subject to express approval by the Board, the fees or dues for membership in appropriate professional organizations shall be paid by the Board. Subject to prior approval by the Board, the Superintendent may attend appropriate professional meetings at the local, state and national levels and shall be reimbursed for any registration fees, tuition, travel, lodging and/or reasonable meal expenses for himself in relation thereto not prepaid by the Board.

16. Superintendent shall be provided paid moving expenses up to \$1000, payable upon receipts to District, in the event Superintendent elects to establish residency in the District, to move his household and all reasonable and customary items of the household, from Cass City, MI, to his residence in the Olivet School District.

17. This Contract contains the entire agreement and understanding by and between the Board and Superintendent with respect to the employment of Superintendent and no prior or concurrent representations, promises, contracts or understandings, written or oral, not contained herein, shall be of any force or effect. All prior contracts or other agreements (written or oral) pertaining to the terms of this contract are cancelled and are superseded by the terms of this contract. Provided, that this contract is voidable pursuant to the provisions of the Revised School Code pertaining to criminal records and criminal history checks.

No amendment to or modification of this Contract shall be valid or binding unless it is in writing, approved by official action of the Board reflected in its minutes, and signed by Administrator and the President and Secretary of the Board. No valid waiver of any provision of this Contract, at any time, shall be deemed a waiver of any other provision of this Contract at such time or at any other time.

18. In the event of any dispute between the parties relating to discharge of Administrator during the term of this Contract, the parties hereby agree to submit such to binding arbitration. Selection of the arbitrator and the arbitration proceedings shall be conducted under the National Rules for the Resolution of Employment Disputes of, and administered by, the American Arbitration Association. Arbitration under this provision shall be conducted pursuant to the terms of the Michigan Uniform Arbitration Act, MCL 691.1681 *et seq.*

The parties intend that this process of dispute resolution shall be inclusive of all contract and statutory claims advanced by Superintendent arising from Superintendent's discharge during the term of this Contract, including (but not limited to) claims of unlawful discrimination and all claims for damages or other relief. However, this agreement to arbitrate does not restrict Administrator from filing a claim or charge with any state or federal agency (such as the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission or the Michigan Department of Civil Rights), and does not apply to any claims for unemployment compensation or workers' compensation which may be brought by Superintendent. Instead, this agreement to arbitrate claims applies to those matters which would otherwise be subject to state or federal court proceedings.

This agreement to arbitrate means that Superintendent is waiving his/her right to adjudicate discrimination claims in a judicial forum and is instead opting to arbitrate those claims. In any such arbitration proceeding, Superintendent shall have the right to representation by counsel of his/her choice, the right to appointment of a neutral arbitrator, the right to reasonable discovery and the right to a fair hearing. However, Superintendent, through this agreement to arbitrate such claims, does not waive any statutory rights or remedies in the context of such arbitration proceedings.

The arbitrator's fees and the costs imposed by the American Arbitration Association shall be shared equally by the Board and Superintendent, subject to the right of Superintendent to seek to tax such fees as costs against the Board.

Any claim for arbitration under this provision must be filed with the American Arbitration Association, in writing, and served on the Board within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of Superintendent's discharge during the term of this Contract. The Decision and Award of the

arbitrator shall be final and binding and judgment thereon may be entered in the Circuit Court for the 56th Judicial Circuit of Michigan (Eaton County), pursuant to applicable provisions of the Michigan Uniform Arbitration Act.

19. If any provision of this Agreement becomes or is declared by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, unenforceable or void, this Contract shall continue in full force and effect without said provision(s).

20. Superintendent agrees that any claim or suit arising out of Superintendent's employment with the Board must be filed no more than six (6) months after the date of the employment action that is the subject of the claim or suit. Superintendent understands that the statute of limitations for claims arising out of an employment action may be longer than six (6) months, but agrees to be bound by the six (6) month period of limitation set forth herein and waives any statute of limitations to the contrary. Should a court of competent jurisdiction determine that this provision allows an unreasonably short period of time to commence a lawsuit, it is the intent of the parties that the court enforce this provision to the extent possible and declare the law suit barred unless it was brought within the minimum reasonable time within which the suit should have been commenced.

21. This Contract is executed on behalf of the Olivet School District pursuant to the authority granted as contained in the resolution of the Board adopted on the 23th of May , 2016, the same being incorporated herein by reference.

5. Charges with respect to which benefits are provided under any Workers' Compensation or similar law
6. Vision examination, lenses or frames which would have been furnished without cost in the absence of this insurance or for which an insured person has no legal obligation to pay.
7. The extra cost of progressive lenses
8. The cost of frames that exceeds the plan allowance
9. Charges from Providers for cosmetic (elective) contact lenses, including the examination, that exceed the plan allowance
