THIS EXTENDED AGREEMENT SHALL UPON RATIFICATION BY BOTH PARTIES BE EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2021, EXCEPT AS INDICATED HEREIN AND SHALL CONTINUE IN EFFECT UNTIL AUGUST 31, 2024. IT SHALL INCLUDE THE 2006-2010 MASTER AGREEMENT, THE CONTRACT EXTENSION DATED AUGUST 26, 2009, THE CONTRACT EXTENSION DATED JUNE 6, 2011, A LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING DATED FEBRUARY 14, 2013, A LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING DATED MARCH 25, 2013, THE LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING DATED FEBRUARY 26, 2016, THE LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING DATED MAY 11, 2018, AND THE LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING DATED JUNE 23, 2021.

ALL CHANGES TO THE PREVIOUS AGREEMENTS SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THIS AGREEMENT EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE INDICATED.

ARTICLE III

G. (NEW F) If a teacher shall be permanently assigned to teach more than the normal teaching load as set forth in this Article, he/she shall receive additional compensation at one-fifth (1/5)-AS IDENTIFIED BELOW:

DAKOTA AND CHIPPEWA VALLEY HIGH SCHOOLS, INCLUDING BOTH 10-12 AND NINTH GRADE CENTERS, ARE LIMITED TO 18% OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF STAFF AT:

- 16% OF STAFF-ELEVEN PERECENT (11%) OR \$7,200, WHICHEVER IS GREATER. THIS SHALL BE CALCULATED BY MULTIPLYING THE BASE SALARY BY 5.5% PER SEMESTER.
- 17% OF STAFF-TWELVE PERCENT (12%) OR \$8,100, WHICHEVER IS GREATER. THIS SHALL BE CALCULATED BY MULTIPLYING THE BASE SALARY BY 6.0% PER SEMESTER.
- 18% OF STAFF-THIRTEEN PERCENT (13%) OR \$9,000, WHICHEVER IS GREATER. THIS SHALL BE CALCULATED BY MULTIPLYING THE BASE SALARY BY 6.5% PER SEMESTER.

ALGONQUIN, IROQUOIS, SENECA, AND WYANDOT ARE LIMITED TO 4% OF THE TOTAL STAFF AT ALL MIDDLE SCHOOLS - NO MORE THAN 2 TEACHERS AT ALGONQUIN AND WYANDOT AND 3 AT THE OTHER MIDDLE SCHOOLS MAY BE ASSIGNED A SIXTH HOUR AT ANY TIME. MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHER TEACHING AN ADDITIONAL ASSIGNMENT WILL BE PAID ELEVEN PERCENT (11%) OR \$7,200, WHICHEVER IS GREATER. THIS SHALL BE CALCULATED BY MULTIPLYING THE BASE SALARY BY 5.5% PER SEMESTER.

NO TEACHER SHALL BE REQUIRED TO TEACH A SIXTH HOUR FOR MORE THAN ONE SEMESTER.

ANYONE WHO IS TEACHING A SIXTH HOUR SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO TRAVEL ON THEIR LUNCH.

THIS LANGUAGE WILL SUNSET ON AUGUST 30, 2024

H. When a teacher accepts an assignment upon occasion to be IS a substitute teacher during his/her relief preparation period, he/she shall receive pay for such at the rate of Thirty THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$35.00) IN THE 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR AND FORTY Dollars (\$30.00) (\$40.00) per period IN 2022-23 GOING FORWARD.

ARTICLE IV

B. Class sizes must be within the contractual maximums within nine (9) school days of the first student day. CURRENT CONTRACT...SEE SECTION C. ELEMENTARY K-5 STEP I-III AND SECONDARY 6-12 WILL NOT BE IN FORCE FOR THE LIFE OF THE CONTRACT, EXCEPT AS FOLLOWS:

CLASS SIZES IN ARTICLE IV (B) (GRADES 6-12), MAY BE EXCEEDED BY TWO (2) STUDENTS UNLESS IT IS AGREED TO EXCEED CLASS SIZE BY MORE IN WRITING BY THE ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT. TEACHERS WILL BE PAID \$4 PER STUDENT PER HOUR FOR EACH STUDENT OVER 33 IN GRADE 6 AND 34 IN GRADES 7-12. MAXIMUM CLASS SIZE FOR GRADE 6 IS 34. MAXIMUM CLASS SIZE FOR GRADES 7-12 IS 35.

ELEMENTARY CLASSROOMS (K-1) MAY BE OVER BY ONE (1) BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL. GRADES 2-5 MAY BE OVER BY 2 ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.

WHEN AN ELEMENTARY STUDENT IS ASSIGNED TO A TEACHER'S CLASS AND CAUSES THAT TEACHER TO BE OVER MAXIMUM CLASS SIZE, THE TEACHER WILL EITHER CHOOSE TO HAVE A PARAPRO FOR ONE HOUR PER STUDENT OVER OR BE PAID \$4.00 PER STUDENT PER HOUR, PRORATED FOR SUCH OVERAGE. THIS ALSO APPLIES TO SPECIALS TEACHERS. CLASS SIZE MAXIMUMS FOR SPECIALS ARE GRADE LEVEL MAXIMUMS. SPECIALS TEACHERS WILL PROVIDE THE BUILDING PRINCIPAL A LIST OF THE CLASSES THEY HAVE SEEN ON ROTATION DAYS AND THE DATES, ARTICLE XXIV APPLIES TO ALL OVERAGES.

CLASS SIZE MAXIMUMS FOR SCIENCE IN THE CVVA WILL BE THE CLASS SIZE MAXIMUMS FOR GENERAL EDUCATION CLASSES.

THIS OVERAGE LANGUAGE MAY ONLY BE USED FOR SCHOOL OF CHOICE AND STUDENTS WITHIN THE ATTENDANCE AREA. IT MAY NOT BE USED TO REASSIGN A STUDENT FROM OUTSIDE THE SCHOOL'S ATTENDANCE AREA.

ALL CLASS SIZE OVERAGE LANGUAGE WILL SUNSET ON AUGUST 30, 2024.

A SPLIT/BLENDED CLASS MAY BE ASSIGNED A BLEND SUPPORT COACH FOR A FULL DAY WHILE THERE ARE CVVA BLENDS. IF THERE ARE NO CVVA BLENDS THEN THE BLEND SUPPORT COACH WILL BE PROVIDED FOR A HALF DAY. THEY WILL NOT BE PART OF THE BARGAINING UNIT. THEY ARE NOT TO PERFORM ANY DUTIES CURRENTLY PERFORMED BY DISTRICT PARAPROFESSIONALS WHEN THEY ARE A BLEND SUPPORT COACH. THE TEACHER OF THE BLEND MUST SEE ALL STUDENTS IN THE BLEND CLASS OVER THE COURSE OF THE DAY.

O. Staff meetings may be called once a week for a ...with a maximum of thirty-one meetings TWENTY- NINE MEETINGS per school year. FOR THE 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR, TEN (10) OF THESE MEETINGS MAY BE USED FOR COLLABORATION. FOR THE 2022-23 SCHOOL YEAR, ELEVEN (11) OF THESE MEETINGS MAY BE USED FOR COLLABORATION. FOR THE 2023-24 SCHOOL YEAR, TWELVE (12) OF THESE MEETINGS MAY BE USED FOR COLLABORATION.

COLLABORATION IS DEFINED AS TEACHERS WORKING TOGETHER IN ASSIGNED GROUPS FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING INSTRUCTION. THESE MEETINGS WILL BE SCHECH APPROVED. THE FOLLOWING PRINCIPLES APPLY TO COLLABORATION MEETINGS:

- THERE CAN BE NO REQUIRED PREPARATION IN ADVANCE OF THE MEETING.
- THERE CAN BE NO OUTSIDE READING ASSIGNED PRIOR TO THE MEETING.

THERE CAN BE NO WORK REQUIRED TO BE DONE AFTER THE MEETING, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO EXIT SLIPS, WORK PRODUCT, OR MINUTES OF THE MEETING. TIME NEEDS TO BE ALLOWED FOR THOSE TO BE COMPLETED DURING COLLABORATION TIME.

COLLABORATION MEETINGS SHALL INCLUDE DATA REVIEW. TEACHERS MAY BE REQUIRED TO ACCESS
AND REVIEW DATA DURING THE MEETING.

COLLABORATION MEETINGS WILL NOT BE SCHEDULED DURING CONFERENCE WEEKS OR WEEKS WHERE
THERE ARE THREE (3) OR LESS TEACHER DAYS.

THIS LANGUAGE WILL SUNSET ON AUGUST 30, 2024.

INSTRUCTIONAL CAMERAS ONLY MAY BE USED IN THE CLASSROOM. THE TEACHER HAS CONTROL OF WHEN THE CAMERA IS USED DURING THE SCHOOL DAY, WITH THE EXCEPTIONS NOTED IN THE ATTACHED LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING.

ARTICLE V

H. The staff Current Contract If they are an intern for longer than one (1) semester their job will be posted...and... allows. THIS IS LIMITED TO A MAXIMUM OF FOUR (4) POSITIONS FOR EACH SCHOOL YEAR. ANY INTERN MUST RETURN TO THEIR CLASSROOM AFTER ONE YEAR AND STAY IN THE CLASSROOM FOR ONE (1) SCHOOL YEAR IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO BECOME AN INTERN AGAIN.

A SUBSTITUTE TEACHER WILL BE PLACED IN THE CLASSROOM FROM WHICH THE INTERN WAS RELEASED. THIS LANGUAGE WILL SUNSET ON AUGUST 30, 2024.

NEW ANCILLARY ASSIGNMENT PROCEDURE ELEMENTARY SOCIAL WORKERS
ELEMENTARY SOCIAL WORKERS WILL REMAIN IN THEIR ASSIGNED ELEMENTARY BUILDING UNLESS ONE (1) OF THE FOLLOWING OCCUR:

- (A) RETIREMENT/RESIGNATION/ OF AN ELEMENTARY SOCIAL WORKER
- (B) REDUCTION OR INCREASE OF ELEMENTARY SOCIAL WORKERS
- (C) INCREASE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS (CLP, ECSE) ASSIGNED TO AN ELEMENTARY BUILDING IF ONE OF THE ABOVE OCCUR, THEN ELEMENTARY SOCIAL WORKERS WILL FOLLOW THE ANCILLARY ASSIGNEMENT PROCEDURE IN ARTICLE V.

Ancillary Assignment Procedure

In cooperation with the Special Education Ancillary staff, the Special Education Director will determine the staffing needs and assignment components for ADD ELEMENTARY AND ... Work Study Coordinator. The rest of the language remains the same.

NEW FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASSIGNMENTS, ALL ELL TEACHERS WILL BE CONSIDERED A DEPARTMENT.

ARTICLE VI

- G. 1. The number of years of teaching experience other than Chippewa Valley, excluding substitute teaching. YOU NEED TO HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED AND UNDER CONTRACT WITH A SCHOOL, OR SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE FOLLOWING IS COUNTED FOR OUTSIDE EXPERIENCE:
 - a. ADULT EDUCATION
 - b. OUT OF STATE TEACHING
 - c. PRIVATE OR PAROCHIAL SCHOOL

d. PRESCHOOL, IF CERTIFIED

3. A one-time YEARLY lottery shall be held for all individuals whose name appears...grouping, etc.

ARTICLE VIII

N. Providing...released teacher. Current Contract. NEW. IF THIS DOES NOT MEET THE LEGALLY MANDATED PAYMENT, THEN THE ASSOCIATION SHALL PAY THE MANDATED PAYMENT.

ARTICLE XV

NEW C.5. THE BOARD MAY CHOOSE TO RELEASE UP TO 5 FTE TEACHERS TO ASSIST IN CURRICULUM INSTRUCTION OR CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT, OR INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY. THESE TEACHERS WILL BE SELECTED BY THE BOARD. THESE TEACHERS ARE NOT TO BE CONSIDERED TEACHER LEADERS FOR PURPOSES OF EVALUATION. A CLASSROOM POSITION WILL BE SAVED FOR THESE TEACHERS. IN THE 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR THREE (3) OF THE CURRICULAR LEADERS MAY HAVE BEEN A CURRICULAR LEADER IN THE PAST. AT THE DISCRETION OF THE ADMINISTRATION, CURRICULAR LEADERS SELECTED IN 2021-22 WILL REMAIN CURRICULAR LEADERS FOR THE BALANCE OF THIS CONTRACT UNLESS THE TEACHER VOLUNTARILY RESIGNS FROM THAT POSITION. THIS LANGUAGE WILL SUNSET ON AUGUST 30, 2024.

C 2. Curricular leaders shall perform the following duties:

- (a) Coordinate and review with consultants, and/or coordinators, curricular changes, applications, innovations, implementations, and services to the staff under the direction if the Superintendent/designee. NEW (a) COORDINATE WITH CLASSROOM TEACHERS TO HELP DEVELOP AND/OR INTEGRATE NEW, USEFUL AND EFFECTIVE TEACHING PRACTICES AND/OR LESSONS OF CURRENT CURRICULUM OR NEW LEARNING PROGRAMS BEING ADOPTED.
- (b) Coordinate and review with department members and the building Principal curricular changes, applications, innovations, and implementations.
- (c) Coordinate selection of texts in their area. WITH THE CURRICULUM COUNCIL.
- (d) Consult with teachers on a scheduled basis in all buildings for the purpose of improving instruction. AT THE TEACHER'S REQUEST, CONSULT WITH TEACHERS IN THEIR AREA FOR THE PURPOSE OF INTEGRATING CURRENT AND RELEVANT EVIDENCE BASED LEARNING STRATEGIES TO SUPPORT INSTRUCTION. AT THE TEACHER'S REQUEST, MODEL AN ACTIVITY OR LESSON IN THE TEACHER'S CLASSROOM.
- (e) Develop and coordinate with other Curricular Leaders, In-Service Workshops, WITH INPUT FROM TEACHERS AND CURRICULUM COUNCIL.
- (f) Chair curricular meetings in their area of competency at various grade levels
- (g) Assist in coordination of the program in their area between buildings. FACILITATE RESOURCE SHARING AND COLLABORATION BETWEEN BUILDINGS AND AT EACH GRADE LEVEL.
- (h) Serve as Chairperson if the District Curriculum Council in their areas.
- (i) NEW. MEET REGULARLY WITH DEPARTMENT CHAIRS TO UPDATE THEM ON THE CURRICULUM FOR THEIR AREA.
- (j) NEW. PROVIDE COPIES OF CURRICULUM COUNCIL MINUTES TO ALL STAFF.
- (k) NEW. USE THE CURRICULUM PROCESS, AS IDENTIFIED IN THIS ARTICLE, WHEN PROPOSING CURRICULAR CHANGES, CLASSES, AND PROGRAMS.
- (I) NEW. DISCUSS AND SEEK INPUT FOR ANY CHANGES IN THE REPORT CARD FROM THE CURRICULUM COUNCIL.

STIPEND/PERCENTAGE AMOUNTS MAY BE RECOMMENDED TO BE CHANGED, EITHER UP OR DOWN, BY CONSENSUS OF THE COMMITTEE. THAT IS, ALL MEMBERS MUST AGREE TO A CHANGE FOR IT TO BE A RECOMMENDATION. ONCE A RECOMMENDATION IS MADE BY THE COMMITTEE, IT WILL BE TAKEN TO THE ASSOCIATION AND BOARD FOR RATIFICATION OF AMENDED SCHEDULES B1 AND B2.
